 - Photocopying requests must be made at least 30 minutes before the library closes.


Support for the Disabled Users

- For the Visually Impaired people
 - The library provides a face-to-face reading service (reservation required) and loans of recorded and braille translated materials by mail (registration required). Inquiries: Service room for the visually impaired (3rd Floor).
 - Audio and magnifying reading aids, large-print books, enlarged manuscripts, and other aids are also available.
- For the Hearing or Language-Impaired people
 - The library provides assistance through written communication at the General Information Counter (1st floor).
 - The library accepts inquiries by facsimile or email (Registration is required to ask questions by fax)
- Wheelchair loan service
 - Please make a request at the reception counter (1st floor).

Library Requests

- Please refrain from eating or drinking in the reading room. However, beverages in screw-top bottles or in other spill resistant containers are permitted (except for the Special Collections Room).
- Unauthorized photography is prohibited. If you wish to take photos inside the library, consult the library staff at General Information Counter (1st floor).
- Phone use is permitted only in the designated areas: Locker Room (1st floor) and Cafeteria (5th floor).

【How to get to the Library】

- Tokyo Metro Hibiya line — 8-minute walk from Exit1 of Hiroo station — 20-minute walk from Roppongi station
 - Tokyo Metro Namboku line — 20-minute walk from Azabu-Juban station
 - Toei Oedo line — 20-minute walk from Azabu-Juban station — 20-minute walk from Roppongi station
 - Toei Bus Hashi Route 86 (Meguro station - Shinbashi station/Tokyo Tower) — 2-minute walk from Akiu Clinic stop
 - Minato City community bus (Chibus) — 2-minute walk from Akiu Clinic stop #97 of the Azabu-Nishi route — 3-minute walk from "Honmura Shogakkou Iriguchi" bus stop at Azabu-West Route 101-2
- A parking lot that accommodates about 20 cars is available for library users. Other than these, two parking spaces are reserved for disabled users.

Inventory days ▶ First Thursday of every month

(Second Thursday if the first Thursday falls on a national holiday or another closed day.)

(May vary depending on the month.)

Special inventory period ▶ 12 days or less a year

Year-end and New Year's holidays ▶ December 29 to January 3

Of its total collection of 2.32 million volumes, around 350,000 materials are available in open stacks. Other materials are kept in closed stacks and are available for viewing upon request.

Entering the Library

- Please obtain a reader's card at the reception counter (1st floor). Personal identification is not required. This card must be presented when requesting materials stored in the closed stacks or using the online databases.
- Please leave big baggage in the locker.

Leaving the Library

- Please return all library materials before you leave the library. If you exit through a security gate with any library materials, an alarm will sound. If this happens, our library staff will check your belongings.
- Return your reader's card at the reception counter (1st floor).

Use of Library Materials

- Materials available in reading rooms can be freely taken to any reading room in the library.
- To use materials held in closed stacks, please make requests through the library's online catalog.
- To view newspapers in the closed stacks, fill out the Material Request Form and apply at the Pick-up/Return Counter (1st floor).
- We do not provide the loan service.

Use of Online Database Seats, Internet Seats and Research Rooms (5th floor)

- Make a reservation using a booking terminal located inside the library (1st and 5th floors).
- Online database seats and internet seats are available for up to a maximum of 60 minutes at a time and research rooms can be used for up to a maximum of 5 hours at a time.
- More than 30 types of online databases are available, including magazine and newspaper articles, court precedents, and corporate information. Note that CD-Eyes50 (Tokyo Shoko Research (TSR)) is outside the scope of the reservation system.

Use of PCs and Wi-Fi

- You can use your own laptop at all seats on the 1st to 4th floors, as well as the Research Room on the 5th floor, Group Study Room and the cafeteria.
- TOKYO FREE Wi-Fi (registration required) is available for use in the reading seats, as well as in the entrance, cafeteria, and other locations.

Use of e-Books

- You can access e-books via the library's tablets. You can also use your own devices, if you connect to the TOKYO FREE Wi-Fi (registration required) in the library.
- Contents for around 4,000 titles are available for use within the library.






